Do you need a highschool diploma to be a real estate agent in texas

More than a dozen states require real estate salespeople to be high school graduates. Real estate can be a lucrative career, depending on how much time and effort you put into it. The U.S. was home to more than three million real estate agents and brokers in 2020, reports the National Association of Realtors. The competition is tough, but you can make it through. The first step is to complete training and get a real estate license. In most states, aspiring real estate agents need a high school diploma or GED to obtain licensure. However, if you live in Texas, Missouri, Arizona, California or Arkansas, you only need pre-license education. Education Requirements Vary by State Depending on where you live, you could become a real estate agent in as little as two or three months. Most states require a high school diploma and 30 to 90 hours of pre-licensing education. The state of Indiana, for example, only issues licenses to applicants who are over 18 years old and have a high school diploma or equivalent. Candidates must also complete 90 hours of training and pass the licensing examination. Ohio law, on the other hand, requires a high school diploma or equivalent and 120 hours of pre-licensing training at a state-approved college or university. Applicants must complete a training program that covers real estate practices and other related topics. You'll also need to undergo a criminal background check and find a sponsoring broker before submitting your application, explains Ohio Realtors. The sponsoring broker will act as a mentor and guide you through your first years as a real estate agent. Once the above steps are completed, you must take and pass an exam to obtain your license. One of the few states that don't require a high school diploma is Texas. Aspiring real estate agents over the age of 18 must complete 180 hours of training, pass a background check and take a licensing exam. If you meet these requirements, you will receive an inactive license. Next, you must find a sponsoring broker and work under his guidance before you can get an active license, according to the Texas Real Estate Commission. If you live in Arizona, you don't need a high school diploma to become a real estate agent. However, you must complete 90 hours of pre-licensing education and pass a state licensing exam. The training can be completed online. Alaska, Arkansas, California, Colorado, Delaware, Missouri and other states have similar requirements – you may apply for a license without graduating from high school, but you must undergo specialized training. Some states, such as Missouri, only require 48 hours of pre-licensing education. Real Estate Pre-Licensing Courses While not all states require a high school diploma or GED, real estate pre-licensing education is mandatory. For starters, make sure you choose a state-approved school. Ohio Realtors provides a list of colleges offering pre-license education. Depending on your preferences, you may complete training at Belmont College, Clark State College, Edison State Community College or other schools. If you plan to work as a real estate sales agent in Hawaii, sign up for pre-licensing courses at Abe Lee Seminars, Seiler School of Real Estate or Continuing Ed Express. Generally, pre-licensing courses cover the legal aspects of real estate, as well as business law, property management, real estate appraisal, general accounting and escrows. Most states also require post-license education. Such courses are typically offered by the same schools that provide pre-license training. For example, Clark State College in Ohio has a continuing education program and individual courses in real estate business planning, risk management, negotiation, ethics and more. All in all, it takes time and money to become a real estate agent. The legal requirements vary by state and can be confusing for newcomers. Expect to spend a few thousand dollars on pre-licensing courses alone. But even so, it may be worth it if you are good at what you do. Real estate agents can earn anywhere between \$25,000 and \$112,400 or higher, with the median wage being around \$49,000 per year. The Texas Real Estate Commission only requires that you are at least 18 years old when it comes time to apply for your license. In order to qualify to become a Texas real estate agent, you must satisfy the following requirements: 1) Be a U.S. citizen or a lawfully admitted alien. 2) Be at least 18 years old. 3) Meet the Texas Real Estate Commission's qualifications for "honesty, trustworthiness, and integrity". Unfortunately, the TREC does not explicitly say what type of criminal offenses will prevent an applicant from meeting their requirement of "honesty, trustworthiness, and integrity". TREC recommends that you submit a Fitness Determination form along with a Background History form prior to applying for a license. It is difficult to know for certain as TREC does not clearly state what actions would lead to a denial of this qualification. TREC recommends that when in doubt, you should submit a Fitness Determination form, which will allow TREC to review the circumstances surrounding your specific case. Yes, you are not required to be a Texas resident to obtain a Texas real estate license. If you hold an active real estate license in another state, you will have to complete the same licensing process just like any other applicant, however, you may not have to take the national portion of the state exam. You are considered a lawfully admitted alien if you hold a Green card or a Permanent Resident card. A social security number is also required when completing your license application. If you hold any kind of visa, you should contact your immigration authorities and verify that you are lawfully in the U.S. Yes, you can still obtain a Texas real estate license if you are a lawfully admitted alien. Yes, you can certainly obtain a Texas real estate salespersons license if you have student loans. TREC only wants to verify that you are not delinquent on any of your student loan payments. You need a total of 180 prelicensing hours approved by the Texas Real Estate Commission (TREC) along with fingerprints, a background check, and a passing exam, but you don't have to do it solo. This article will provide step-by-step instructions on how to get your real estate license in the Lone Star State. Here we go, ya'll. 1. Meet the Legal Requirements for Your Texas Real Estate License The state requirements of Texas are pretty simple: You have to be at least 18 years of age and you either have to be a U.S. citizen or a lawfully admitted alien. Unlike other states that require a high school diploma or GED, Texas does not have any education background requirements. However, if you have any criminal offenses, unpaid judgments, performed unlicensed activity, or discipline taken against a professional or occupational license, you will need to disclose this information using a form called the Fitness Determination (FD). You'll also need to submit a Background History Form. These forms are used by the TREC to determine if you meet their qualifications for honesty, trustworthiness, and integrity and are cleared to get your real estate license. They cost \$50 and can be mailed to the TREC offices. Did you know? Texas does not offer reciprocity with any other state, and it is a physical location state in terms of portability. This means that you are allowed to conduct business in another state, but doesn't allow you to enter the state for the purpose of conducting real estate business. An agent or broker from another state must conduct all out-of-state business remotely and may not enter the state for showings, closings, or any other reason. Complete Required Prelicensing Courses If you've met the state's legal requirements, then it's time to embark on completing the prelicensing education requirement. The courses will cover such topics as: Principles of Real Estate (60 hours) Law of Agency (30 hours) Law of Contracts (30 hours) Promulgated Contracts Forms (30 hours) Real Estate Finance (30 hours) Did you know? According to the TREC rules, if you are a licensed attorney in good standing with the Texas bar, you are exempt from taking the real estate salesperson course. However, they cannot sponsor other real estate salespeople or act as a broker. Apply for Your Texas Real Estate License Once you've completed your prelicensing hours, you can visit the TREC website to apply for your license or submit via mail. You will have one year from the date of your application to complete the remaining steps required to become an agent in Texas, or the application will be terminated. It's also worth noting that the state will require payment and time to process your application as well: Processing time: On average, it can take up to four weeks for your application to be processed and approved. Texas real estate application fee: \$185 (online, checks, money orders) Once your application has been processed, the state will consider your Texas real estate license inactive until you pass the real estate exam and find a sponsoring brokerage. Only then will the state designate an applicant's license as active. To apply for your initial license, you'll need the following: That said, if you have already found a brokerage to sponsor you prior to passing your exam and being approved by TREC, you may use the Sales Agent Sponsorship Form instead of the Application for Inactive Sales License. 4. Get Your Fingerprint & Background Check TREC requires that all applicants receive a background check and have fingerprint history on file. Fingerprinting is completed by a third-party company called MorphoTrust. If you've already submitted fingerprints, they should be on file and therefore not needed again. If you do not have fingerprints, you can make an appointment online with MorphoTrust at a location convenient for you. The cost for fingerprinting is \$38.25 if you have not been previously fingerprinted for TREC, and an additional \$10 for initial license applicants. 5. Take the Texas Real Estate Exam Now that you've completed all the paperwork and your courses, you should be ready and rarin' to schedule and pass your real estate exam. The passing rate for the Texas real estate license exam is about 60%, and you will have three attempts to pass the national and state portions. After each attempt, you will receive a scorecard that will inform you of the sections you excelled at and those you failed so you can determine where to focus on your studies. You can reschedule your exam 24 hours after your failed attempt. If you fail one portion of the exam three times, you must take an additional 30 hours of education. However, if you fail both portions, you must take an additional 60 hours of education. Texas Real Estate Exam Details Schedule Your Exam Exams are scheduled directly through PearsonVUE, which a global testing company, but it handles real estate testing for Texas.
